Help Needed to Find Lee

Houston, TX: **The Houston Humane Society (HHS) sadly announced today that one of their long time residents was stolen out of their mobile adoption van while it was parked in the 2500 block of Dunlavy.** At their doggy fashion show last night, 10 canines were featured throughout the evening in various outfits. At the end of the night, volunteers and staff secured the animals into the mobile adoption van behind two shut doors for transport back to the shelter. Upon return to the shelter it was discovered that one of the dogs had been taken.

“Lee was rescued from a horrible puppy mill situation just over a year ago,” said Monica Schmidt, of the Houston Humane Society. “Our hope is that whoever took him will do the right thing and return him safely to us.”

Because of the sad start Lee had in a puppy mill, he is timid and easily frightened. He has been neutered, tattooed, and microchipped. Photos have been attached.
