MAKE A PLAN:

Having a plan in place saves time and reduces stress during emergencies. It helps you act quickly and keep everyone-people and pets-safe.

1 Know Your Risks -

Understand your area's hurricane threats and evacuation zones.



2 Make a Family Plan -

Decide where to go, how to communicate, and what everyone's role is.



3 Include Pets -

Plan for pet-friendly shelters or hotels and pack a pet emergency kit.



4 Stay Informed -

Sign up for local alerts and keep a batterypowered radio handy.




5 Practice Your Plan -

Run through your plan with your family so everyone knows what to do.



BUILD A KIT

An emergency evacuation kit for your pet ensures they have food, water, medications, & comfort items ready to go. It saves time during an evacuation & helps keep your pet safe, healthy, and less stressed in a crisis.

Pet Emergency Preparedness Checklist



PREPARE, KEEP THEM SAFE!

- ☐ Microchip Ensure your pet's microchip is registered/updated
 ☐ Vet Records (Vaccination records, rabies vaccine number, etc.)
 ☐ Research pet-friendly accommodations
 ☐ Rabies Certificate
- Recent and clear pet photos

NECESSITIES

- 2 Week Supply of Food/Litter
- 2 Week Supply of Water (bottled water)
- Portable Bowls (for food & water), litter box
- Feeding Instructions: Provide details about your pet's specific diet & feeding schedule.
- 2 Week Supply of Medication and clear instructions


ESSENTIALS

- Waterproof Containers, sealable ziploc bags
- Collar with IDs (updated contact information)
- Pet Carrier (appropriate size; your pet should be able to turn around comfortably in the carrier)
- Cleaning Supplies (paper towels, canine potty pads, disposal bags, & disinfectant)
- Favorite toys or blankets
